

Scavenger Hunt: TAFE Ethical Dilemma Competition (Key)

To become familiar with the rules and guidelines of the TAFE Ethical Dilemma Competition, complete the scavenger hunt. For further assistance, refer to “TAFE Ethical Dilemma Competition” handout.

1. How many entries can there be per chapter? **1**
2. What kind of event is this?
 - a. Individual
 - b. **Team (2 – 4 members may present)**
 - c. Both a and b
3. What are the main objectives of this competition?
 - To give each of the chapters members an opportunity to think deeply about an ethical issue.
 - To give the chapter an opportunity to debate an ethical education-related dilemma.
 - To employ critical-thinking skills and to use persuasive communication techniques to collaboratively debate an ethical dilemma and come to a consensus.
 - Give members an opportunity to practice collaborating, problem solving, and reflecting.
4. True or **False**. Participants have the option of preparing a presentation describing the process the chapter went through to reach a consensus.
Participants must prepare a presentation describing the process the chapter went through to reach a consensus.
5. True or **False**. During a chapter meeting, members should present the ethical dilemma narrative found on an educational website.
During a chapter meeting, present the ethical dilemma narrative found on the TAFE website.
6. In preparing for the Ethical Dilemma Competition, during a chapter meeting, members should present the ethical dilemma narrative. List the four additional components of preparing for the competition.
 - Each member of the chapter must first thoroughly think through the ethical issue and begin to form an individual position on the topic.
 - Then the chapter members must debate the topic listening carefully to each other’s opinions. Through the discussion, the chapter members must come to a consensus on the topic.
 - Spend adequate time discussing the dilemma. This deliberation may take several chapter meetings. As a group, answer the ethical dilemma questions listed at the end of the ethical dilemma narrative.
 - When the discussions have concluded and a consensus has been reached, the chapter will prepare a ten minute presentation stating the chapter’s view on the dilemma.
